Special Needs Project and Moving-On Project

Do you or your coworker have a child with a disability?

You or your co-worker might qualify for the UPCE-PSAC Special Needs Project under Appendix H of the collective agreement (Child Care Fund).

Two unique projects:

The **Special Needs Project** helps parents deal with the emotional, financial and physical stresses of working and having a child with special disabilities. It has been available to UPCE-PSAC members since the union negotiated its Child Care Fund with Canada Post in 2000.

The **Moving-On Project** began in 2005 and is geared towards families with dependent adult sons and daughters who have special needs. When children with disabilities turn 19, they no longer have access to supports that were available to them before, yet their needs remain. The project helps support families with additional challenges when their sons and daughters "move on" to adulthood.
